The last race was won by the French sailor FRANÇOIS GABART in 78 days, 2 hours, 16 minutes and 40 seconds.



The departure took place on November 6th 2016, at Les Sables d'Olonne in Vendée.

The favourites are ALEX THOMSON, a British sailor, and the French Armel CLEACH. Both are ahead in the race.

The Vendée Globe was created by Philippe Jeantot and Philippe de Villliers. The first race took place in 1989. Two persons have already died during this running: the American Nigel Burgess and the Canadian Gerry Roufs.



This running is organized every 4 years. The departure is in November for better meteorological conditions.

There have already been several books and one film on the Vendée Globe.

The History of an unsinkable boat

The Titanic was built at Belfast (Northern Ireland) between 1909 and 1912.

It was a white cruise ship who construction was undertaken by Thomas ANDROUWS who was the architect.



<u>Weight</u> =5,200 tons <u>Cost</u> = 7, 5 million American Dollars <u>Length</u> =269 meters <u>Bridges</u> = 10

He was launched in the water on 31st May 1911 and was brought in a great basin. It was finished in march 1912

The inaugural trip

On 10th April 1912, the Titanic was launched to the sea in Southampton to go to New-York.

There were 2300 passengers with some famous people: commanding Officer John Smith, John Jacob Astor 4, Benjamin Guggenheim, Margaret Brow, Isidore Straws ...

The trip should have last five days with two ports of call.

The passengers were distributed into 3 classes:

- the first class was luxurious with the swimming pool and a great living room.
- the second class for the middle class.
- the third poor class (for the immigrants)

How the impossible arrived...

On the nights of 14 April 1912 at 11:40 in the North Atlantic, 2 officers were surprised by the presence of an iceberg. A few minutes later, the Titanic bumped into the iceberg. Shortly afterwards, the commanding officer ordered women and children to go up the rescue boats but there were not enough for 2300 passengers.

Number of survivors = 732

Number of dead persons=1,500



This tragic event remains today the biggest maritime shipwreck of all time.

Boats, boats and boats!

The Vendée Globe 2016-2017 is the eighth edition of this race. The start was given on 6 November 2016 in the bay of *Les Sables-d'Olonne* at 1h20 pm. This major event of the IMOCA circuit consists in a solo race on board of 60 feet monohulls. In total, the race is 24 394 miles long.

The boats allowed to participate are monohull sailboats with a length between 59 and 60 feet, about 18 meters. These boats must meet the latest rules of the 60 feet IMOCA class.

The main novelty of this edition is the appearance of foils on these last generation boats. The two supporting appendages are intended to relieve the structure, reduce the drag, and thus increase the speed.



Each competitor has the right to embark nine sails.

The Vendée Globe is a solo, unassisted, and nonstop race.

A competitor is deemed to have completed his qualifying course if he has performed:

- 2008-2009 or Vendée Globe;
- the 2010-2011 or 2014-2015 Barcelona World Race;
- a theoretical 2,500 miles (minimum) solo or double transatlantic race, in IMOCA, after 1 January 2009.

No woman participates in this edition. Vincent Riou is the only former winner to take part in.
